

L'evento OPEN DAYs - COMMERCIAL LOCAL URBAN DISTRICTS' (CLUDs) PROJECT - 7FP MARIE CURIE IRSES è stato organizzato con la finalità di presentare e promuovere il Progetto di ricerca "CLUDs" finanziato nell'ambito dell'azione Marie Curie IRSES del 7° Programma Quadro della Ricerca dell'Unione Europea e sviluppato da un network internazionale formato da 4 Università Europee (Reggio Calabria, Salford, Roma, Uppsala) e 2 Università americane (Northeastern University of Boston, San Diego State University). Il progetto CLUDs ha come obiettivo la progettazione fisica, economico-finanziaria e sostenibile dei centri commerciali naturali tradotti in Commercial Local Urban Districts, creando una forte connessione tra i siti della produzione e le aree di commercializzazione. Le attività di ricerca avranno come elemento innovativo da sviluppare la tematica urban-rural inserita nei processi di partecipazione pubblico-privata per l'attuazione di strategie di rigenerazione urbana, ovvero di rivitalizzazione dei centri minori e di cluster urbani e rurali. L'evento si pone l'obiettivo di coinvolgere gli attori dell'azione pubblica sul territorio già nella fase di start up della ricerca, in modo da intercettare la domanda di innovazione che deve orientare lo svolgimento della ricerca anche nella sua fase di sperimentazione in aree urbane target calabresi. In questi due giorni, verranno sollecitate e raccolte manifestazioni d'interesse da parte degli imprenditori ed enti locali nell'ambito dei processi di rigenerazione urbana legati al tema dei centri commerciali naturali.

The OPEN DAYs - 7FP MARIE CURIE IRSES "COMMERCIAL LOCAL URBAN DISTRICTS' PROJECT (CLUDs) has the objective to present and promote the CLUDs project funded by the 7th Framework Programme of European Union Research within the specific IRSES Marie Curie Action. The implementation of the project is based on a networking of four EU universities (Reggio Calabria, Salford, Uppsala, Rome) and two USA universities (Northeastern University of Boston, San Diego State University). The research project intends to explore the potential of a new tool for renovating degraded public spaces and improving the attractiveness and accessibility of deprived urban areas by focusing on the high potential of local commercial activities. The exploration is oriented to the implementation of an innovative tool, CLUDs, aimed at emphasizing the strategic role of small retail -handcraft and typical food- in reinforcing the sense of community, reducing transportation costs and contributing to the creation of an attractive urban environment, thus producing the increase of private investments. The expected result is to bring together an international and interdisciplinary research team with the purpose of forming an excellent centre of synergy in research and innovation transfer in the field of PPP applied to urban regeneration actions and policies. The OPEN DAYs is finalized to involve local stakeholders in the start up stage of the research in order to capture the innovation demand as guide line for the research development.
