

TECNICHE SAPIENTI INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM

ROME, October 4 and 5, 2021 School of Civil and Industrial Engineering, Cloister Hall

The symposium is dedicated to enhancing the presence of women –students, graduates, scholars, and professors–, which were educated in the technical-scientific schools of the University "La Sapienza" in Rome. Tecniche Sapienti, the title of the conference, refers to these two aspects: the sixteenth-century name of Rome University "La Sapienza", alias the "Wisdom", and the technical education, mainly engineering and architecture, of the women under scrutiny.

The eponymous research project, initiated in 2018, aimed to a twofold approach: on one side, the historical survey which drew attention to the history of science at La Sapienza and highlighted some eminent and overlooked figures of the past; on the other side, the recognition of appropriate actions to increase gender equality within the academic cycle and in the professional.

The topic is very timely and the history of women in science and technology is still little discussed. In addition, the participation of experts and scholars in diverse disciplines will be a strong incentive to promote gender equality.

One main goal will be to expand the web pages of La Sapienza web portal which at the present includes under the heading "Alumni" almost exclusively male figures while, paradoxically, the heading "Distinguished Professors" does not mention any woman.

The curricula and the contributions of female graduates at La Sapienza are poorly known, both in terms of data and of critical reflection. This results in an extensive damage to the image of the University: women are almost completely absent among the many illustrious personalities officially listed, even though some of them became prominent figures in their fields (such as Maria Montessori in education, Emma Castelnuovo in mathematics, and Lina Bo in architecture, to mention a few), while the history of technical disciplines (engineering and architecture), and more generally of science, is incomplete.

The conference aims to examine these topics in depth, referring to a historical period between 1872, when the Pontifical La Sapienza University became a State University of the new Italian Kingdom, and 1969, when the number of female students underwent a surge with the reform and liberalization of access to the University following the movements of May '68.
