









## Framework - Sustainable S3 Wheel







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## **Boston case study – initial findings**

- Established and globally-renowned innovation infrastructure
- Dominated by anchors (universities) and corporates
- Demonstrable strengths spatially and socially (proximity, density, clustering and green space)
- Attempts to curate or re-appropriate cultural elements and sense of place eg. Seaport/District Hall and Roxbury
- Growing recognition of needs and threats, eg. inequality & rising water levels - and to respond to the city's needs, eg water cleaning bio-pellets from food waste
- Evidence of emerging civic agency, eg. Our Harvard Square (citizen-led spatial development)

## **Boston case study – interviews**

#### **SPATIAL**

"Eighty percent of seafood comes in by plane from Europe or Asia"

#### **CULTURAL**

"We are watering the seedlings after having almost no municipal-level funding for arts and culture"

#### **SOCIAL**

"There's a new generation of people in Cambridge who were born here"

### **Lessons from Seattle**

South Lake Union dominated by Amazon estate/work units

"Thirty-thousand people burrowed away in their little boxes thinking how to make online purchasing easier is not innovation"

Public realm/ space designed by private sector developer - "It feels like 'The Truman Show"





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#### **Lessons from Seattle**

Pioneer Square in downtown Seattle emerging as a social innovation and arts district

"What can we do to harness Seattle's famed creativity to solve our big social problems"

Move toward systemic change, for example in evaluating impact – attempt by Mayor's office to quantify and measure 'hope', 'belief', 'happiness' – "To what extent does

somebody believe in you?"







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






#### **Initial assessments**

- GM strong culturally, fair spatially and weak socially
- Boston/Cambridge strong spatially and socially, but weak (Kendal Sq) to fair (Seaport) culturally.
- Seattle South Lake Union weak culturally...
- ... but strong on all three in Pioneer Square
- The 'HOW' is missing, the catalyst











## Series of tri-partite frameworks

- Spatial, social, cultural
- Anchor-hub, regenerated urban area, science park
- Private sector, public sector, third sector
- Place, innovation, people
- Implicit place hierarchy emerging: place-blind, place-based (Foray, Barca, McCann), place-grounded (related to S3 'embeddedness' / sustainability)








### Sustainable S3 Wheel

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## Next Steps – research

- Refine 'fourth way' taxonomy and place hierarchy/ research matrix
- Further interrogate relationship between place-driven an entrepreneurial discovery.
- Isolate success factors, differentiators and common denominators
- Test with expert interviews, research network and EC
- Focus on the 'HOW' what is the catalyst for success?










## **Next Steps – practical**

- Building a civic innovation corridor
- Anchored by GM Impact Hub (CIC model), Co-op, University of Salford
- Bringing private, public, 3<sup>rd</sup> & civic together in a collaborative 'fourth way'
- Non-prescriptive, citizen-led, organic
- Tied to devolution & Mayoral election
- Series of participatory events 'M4' between Feb-May 2017
